Rationale

1.1. A uniform dress code reinforces in students pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the St Albans Heights Primary School community. Students are expected to dress in complete school uniform in a way that reflects a sense of pride in their school and themselves. It provides means of identification and helps to ensure safety of our students, in the schoolyard and in transit to and from the school.

Aims

- To promote equality amongst all students.
- To further develop a sense of pride in, and identification with our school.
- To provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation

It is expected that school uniform is correctly worn at all times as outlined in the St Albans Heights Primary School Uniform Appendix.

Students must wear the uniform in full, as described within any combination of clothing.

Students should wear long or short sleeved Navy/blue polo shirt with the school logo, navy shorts/navy tracksuit pants and supportive closed toe shoes.

A St Albans Heights Primary School SunSmart approved hat is a compulsory part of the school uniform as recommended by the Cancer Council of Victoria. Hats should be worn whilst outside from 1 September to 30 April. Hats should not be worn indoors

For health and safety reasons:

• Long hair, i.e. shoulder-length and longer, must be tied back.

Parents/Carers seeking exemptions to the school's uniform requirements due to religious beliefs, cultural background, student disability, must apply in writing to the school's Principal with supporting evidence.

All uniform items should be clearly named.

All students are required to:

Wear school uniform at school

Wear a navy bucket hat/broad brimmed SAHPS logo hat with any uniform option from 1 September through to 30 April as per the school's SunSmart Policy

Tie long hair i.e. shoulder-length or longer back for health and safety reasons with hair tie (this relates to both girls and boys)

Year 6 Students

Special Year 6 bomber jacket with logo and Year 6 names on the back can be worn with any uniform option.
