

### Communication - via COMPASS

The school has been using the Compass student management system for a while now and parents need to continue to access their online portal as this will be our main method of communication. Please see the office for support if needed. This system will better connect you to your child's learning, as well as give you quick access to attendance records, school events, fortnightly newsletters and student reports.





### **COMPASS Pay**

All events and activities must be authorised online through COMPASS PAY. Parents should log on weekly in order to give consent and pay for all school activities via this portal. Please limit cash transactions at the office as we do not normally carry change.

### Yard Supervision/Drop off and pick up

In line with Department of Education and Training (DET) guidelines, the school provides supervision in the yard from 8.30am until school starts and after school until 3.30pm. Therefore there are staff members on yard duty from 8:30am each morning and until 3:30pm in the afternoon. We ask that parents do not drop off their children before 8.30am and that they collect their children from school before 3.30pm. Staff usually have meetings to attend and preparation to complete for the following day. Your assistance with this matter would be greatly appreciated. #### **Covid Safe Practices**

Parents are allowed to be on school grounds but should not enter buildings, other than the office. Students will line up in their specific area and be taken inside by their teachers at 8.50am. At the end of the school day students will be dismissed from the same lining up area.

All visitors to the school must sanitise their hands prior to entering any internal space. Sharing of school resources will be limited as much as possible at school. All classes/rooms have air purifiers

We encourage any student, staff or family member that is not feeling well and shows any cold and flu like symptoms to stay at home.

### Attendance every day is vital

It important that students attend school every day (when they are well) and that they remain at school for the entire day. Where possible, please do not make appointments for your child during the school day, try not to drop them off late or pick them up early as this disrupts their learning and impacts their absence data. Any absences must be reported to the school office, classroom teacher or entered on COMPASS immediately. A daily SMS will be sent home at 10am each day for any unexplained absences.



#### Uniform

Wearing the correct school uniform is very important as it sets the culture and tone of our school. All students must be in the correct navy school uniform and wear a SunSmart hat when out in the yard. Please note: black is not part of our uniform and all leggings and tops underneath the uniform must be navy in colour. Uniform may be purchased through the school office. If you need assistance or support with this, please contact Ms Christine or see the office staff. Your support is greatly appreciated.





#### **Lunch Orders**

Lunch orders will be available again this year on a Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Orders will need to be placed via the QKR app on your phone or computer. A canteen menu will be distributed with this newsletter. This year St Albans Secondary College will continue to provide this service for us. Homemade lunches should be packed in your child's bag in the morning and not brought in during the school day. The office is quite busy and are unable to distribute lunches every day. Of course, in an emergency we are happy to help.



### Mobile Phone Policy - Implementation

All Victorian government schools are required to implement a local Mobile Phone Policy. The policy requires that students do not bring mobile phones to school, however if they need to for whatever reason the phone MUST be signed in and out at the front office. Students should not have mobile phones on them, in their bags or in the classrooms.

A reminder that personal items of value should not be brought to school by staff or students as the Department of Education doesn't provide cover for any loss or damage. This includes cars parked in or around the school grounds.



### Parking around the school

There is limited parking around the school, you may want to park further away and walk to the school gates with your children. Please follow all parking signs and restrictions in order to avoid a fine. The front of the school is a "Drop and Go' Zone. You may stop here for 2 mins only whilst children get in and out of the vehicle. We ask that you move on quickly to allow others to park and collect their children also.



### **Breakfast Club**

All families are invited to join us in the canteen area for a free breakfast each morning from 8.30am. Everyone is welcome to attend and there is no charge to do so. Ms Leanne and Ms Salma are looking forward to seeing you all.



### Community Hub

#### **School Council Vacancies**

### **Privacy Collection Notice**

Information for students, parents and carers

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) values your privacy and is committed to protecting the personal and health information that schools collect.

All school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law and the Schools' Privacy Policy. This notice explains how the Department, including Victorian government schools (schools), handles personal and health information. On occasion, specific consent will be sought for the collection and use of information, for example, for a student to receive a health service. Our schools are also required by legislation, such as the Education and Training Reform Act 2006, to collect some of this information. Throughout this notice, 'staff' includes principals, teachers, student support service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners, and all other employees, contractors, volunteers and service providers of the school and the Department.

On enrolment, and during the ordinary course of a student's attendance at a school, schools will collect information about students and their families for the following purposes:

- educating students
- supporting students' social and emotional wellbeing, and health
- fulfilling legal obligations, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law
  - communicating and engaging with parents
    - student administration
      - school management
  - supporting policy in relation to student education and wellbeing.

If this information is not collected, schools may be unable to provide optimal education or support to students or fulfil legal obligations.

For example, our schools rely on parents to provide health information about any medical condition or disability that their child has, medication their child may take while at school, any known allergies and contact details of their child's doctor. If parents do not provide all relevant health information, this may put their child's health at risk.

Our schools also require current, relevant information about all parents and carers so that schools can take account of safety concerns that affect their children. Parents should provide schools with copies of all current parenting plans and court orders about or that affect their children and provide updated copies when they change.

When parents enrol their child in primary school, they will be asked to provide personal and health information in several ways, including via the Enrolment Form, the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.



The Enrolment Form is used to collect information that is essential for the purposes listed above, and requests information such as:

- Emergency contacts Individuals parents nominate for a school to contact during an emergency. Parents should ensure that their nominated emergency contact agrees to their contact details being provided to the school and that they understand their details may be disclosed by the Department if lawful, e.g. in the case of emergency communications relating to bush fires or floods.
- Student background information Information about country of birth, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin, language spoken at home and parent occupation. This information enables the Department to allocate appropriate resources to schools. The Department also uses this information to plan for future educational needs in Victoria and shares some information with the Commonwealth government to monitor, plan and allocate resources.
  - Immunisation status This assists schools to manage health risks and legal obligations. The Department may also provide this information to the Department of Health and Department of Families, Fairness and Housing to assess immunisation rates in Victoria, but not in a way which identifies students.
    - Visa status This is required to process a student's enrolment.

All schools may use departmental systems and online tools such as apps and other software to effectively collect and manage information about students and families for the purposes listed above. When schools use these online tools, they take steps to ensure that student information is secure. If parents or carers have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact the school. School staff will only share student and family information with other school staff who need to know to enable them to educate or support the student as described above. Information will only be shared outside the school (and outside the Department) as required or authorised by law, including where sharing is required to meet duty of care, anti-discrimination, occupational health and safety, and child wellbeing and safety obligations. The information collected will not be disclosed beyond the school and Department without parent consent unless such disclosure is lawful.

When a student transfers to another school (including Catholic, independent and interstate), personal and/or health information about that student may be transferred to the next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of the student and assists the next school to provide the best possible education and support to the student. For further detail about how and what level of information is provided to the next school, refer to the: Enrolment: Student transfers between schools

Schools only provide school reports and ordinary school communications to students, parents, carers or others who have a legal right to that information. Requests for access to other student information or by others must be made by lodging a Freedom of Information (FOI) application.

To update student or family information, parents should contact their school.


#### F/1 News

### GRADE 3-6 NEWS BY MR JIMI, MS HELEN, & MS ABBY




The Grade 3/4 students have had a positive start to 2023. In the classroom, we have been establishing routines and expectations that will continue throughout the year.


In literacy, students have chosen books and decided how they would like to organise our classroom libraries. Students have also selected a range of personal library books that will keep them engaged in reading while they work on their reading goal. In writing, students set up their Writer's Notebook by thinking about good 'seeds' for writing. These writing 'seeds' will be used in the future to generate ideas for writing.

In maths, students have explored some challenging problems and to develop their maths mindset. We talked about different problem solving strategies and that it is ok to make mistakes when you are learning new skills. We looked at all the resources in our numeracy Station and students talked about all the ways to use the hands on materials to solve problems.

Just a reminder for 3/4 parents. Students should be reading every night and filling in their Reading Diaries. Homework is sent home on Monday and is due back on Friday each week. Parent logins for SeeSaw have also been sent home and it's great to see so many parents connected to the Grade 3/4

classes.





Currently in Year 56 we are working on improving our writing stamina and using the five senses to improve our descriptions.

Students have been improving their writing stamina, descriptive skills and writing without becoming distracted. Three tips that have helped us improve our writing are:

- 1. Generating Ideas: Set a timer for two minutes and write down as many ideas as you can, without worrying about their quality. This exercise helps you generate ideas quickly, and at the end of the timer you can choose your best idea to begin writing.
- 2. Including descriptions: Practise writing descriptions that involve all five senses sight, sound, smell, taste, and touch. This technique helps bring your writing to life, making it more engaging for the reader.
- 3. Distraction-free writing: Minimise distractions while writing by turning off devices and notifications, finding a quiet place to work and keeping our work areas tidy.

By practising these tips in our writing routine, we have been improving our writing stamina, making it easier for us to write effectively and create more engaging stories.

Hi SAHPS Families

Welcome to a new school year.

Your child/ren would have already started bringing home a book to read every night as well as their school diary to record their reading in.

We ask that you support your child with their nightly reading, which is part of our homework program, by listening to them read, read with them or read to them.

Students are asked to record the book they have read and that a parent/guardian sign the diary at least once a week. Depending on the year level that your child/ren are in they will need to record some information about they have read in their diary. This may be writing a sentence about the book, new vocabulary they have read, information about a character etc.

To make home reading a successful and positive experience for everyone, it is a good idea to establish a routine at home with a time to read and a nice comfy place to enjoy the book.

The graphic below highlights the importance of time spent reading everyday.
