Communication - via COMPASS

All events and activities must be authorised online through COMPASS PAY. Parents should log on weekly in order to give consent and pay for all school activities via this portal. Please limit cash transactions at the office as we do not normally carry change. COMPASS will give you access to attendance records, school events, fortnightly newsletters, student reports, excursions, school photos, camps, opportunity to book Parent Teacher Conferences and Interviews, etc

All permissions for local walks, excursions, ICT use, etc are on COMPASS now, parents need to log on and give consent for these.

Get to Know my Child Interviews

This is an opportunity for you to meet your child's teacher and let them know of any concerns you may have (social, academic and medical) as well as an opportunity to set some joint goals for the year. These will be held on Monday 27/2 after school from 3.30pm – 5.00pm and Wednesday 1/3 from 3.30pm until 5.30pm.

Interviews will be held in the classrooms, they will be 10 mins in duration and families must book on COMPASS. Remember to sanitise and social distance where possible. Mr Noly (Japanese and STEM) and Mr Pody (Art) will be available for pop in visits in their rooms, no need to book. Mr Simon will be unavailable as he will be running cricket sessions. Parents with questions for specialist staff are encouraged to make a time separately to meet with these staff members.

School Council

All government schools in Victoria are governed by a school council. Accident Insurance

The Department of Education and Training does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents are responsible for paying the costs of any medical treatment for injured students, including transport and/or ambulance costs. Insurance policies are available through commercial insurers for those who may be interested.



Personal Items at school

The Department of Education does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools. Principals are requested to remind families of this at the beginning of each academic year. Please avoid bringing unnecessary and/or valuable items to school as it can be quite distressing if these items get damaged or lost. As per DET and school policy, mobile phones should not be brought to school however if they must for whatever reason then phones should be signed in and out of the main office for safe keeping throughout the day.

Tutor Learning Initiative Update

You may or may not be aware of the government's Tutor Learning Initiative program in 2023 to support students who are behind with their learning or need extension work. Schools have been allocated funds based on specific criteria to put plans in place to support the gaps in student learning. Our teachers have worked with the leadership team to analyse learning data and identify students who will benefit from intensive (short term), small group targeted teaching. We will also use this data analysis to drive effective differentiation at the classroom level, enabling ALL students to receive targeted support to stretch their learning and meet their point of need. We will also be ensuring that we maintain the focus on high achievers that need extension work.

Grants Updates

There is lots of work happening in this space. With regard to the \$13.45 million dollar grant, we have signed off on the basic design and are now working on the internal and external designs and finishes. The architects will meet with groups of staff, students and families for input into the next stage of the design.

The Inclusive School's Fund grant of \$160,000 will be going out to tender soon. This will be to update the space behind the brick wall and bicycle racks. The initial design looks amazing.

Another shade sail grant was received late last year for a shade structure on the oval to provide shade during interschool sport too.

We did a language experience lesson. We played in the sandpit and then the grade 1s wrote a sentence about it and the Foundation students practised tracing words to make a sentence.








Mathematics

We have been working on our counting skills. Reading, making, and writing numbers. Grade 1s have been practising using place value of tens and ones to make a number for more efficient counting.









There are entry forms available for students to fill in on the Home Reading Hero wall in Building A.







Staying safe on Discord

Here are some tips for parents to help their children stay safe on Discord:

- 1. Monitor your child's activity on Discord. Ask your child to add you as a friend on the platform and check in on their activity regularly. If your child is using Discord to talk to friends, make sure they are only communicating with people they know in real life
- 2. Make sure your child understands the importance of keeping personal information private. Remind them to never share their full name, address, phone number, or other identifying information with anyone on Discord
- 3. Help your child set up their privacy settings. By default, Discord is open to the public, so it's important to configure the privacy settings to only allow communication with friends or other trusted individuals. Encourage your child to only accept friend requests from people they know
- 4. Turn off direct messaging. This can be done in the privacy settings, and it can help prevent your child from receiving unsolicited messages from strangers
- 5. Finally, if you have any concerns about your child's safety on Discord, don't hesitate to contact the platform's support team or report any abusive or inappropriate behaviour. You can also seek advice from online safety organizations

As a parent, it's important to be proactive in ensuring your child's online safety, and to have open communication with them about their online activity.

Did you know?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important.

Good attendance will help children do well in high school, tertiary education and at work
