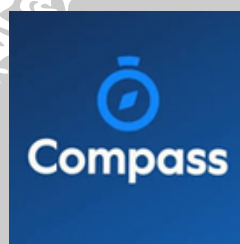


Dear Parents/Guardians,

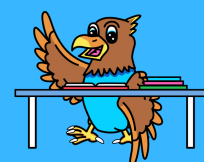

## Grants Update

Inclusive Schools Fund - \$160,000 - project has gone out to tender, with construction due to start later this year. We are upgrading the area behind the brick wall to be a passive space, with seating, shade sails, activities, and a sensory garden.

New building - \$13.45 million dollars is still in the design phase. We are deciding on colours, materials, interior spaces, etc. The architects will be ready to share the plans soon with the wider community in order to seek feedback.

Shade Sail - a new shade sail to be installed on the oval for Interschool Sports.

### **Celebrating Birthdays at SAHPS**

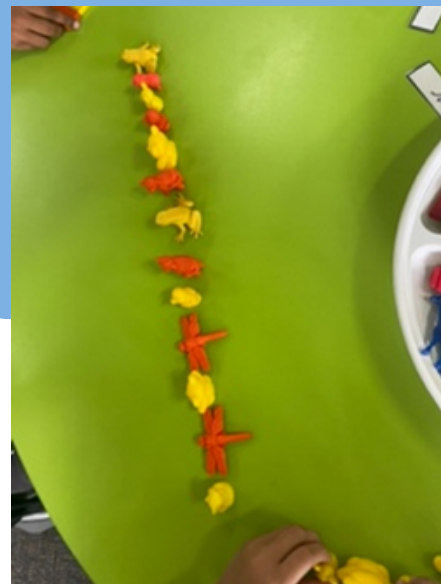

Students have enjoyed language experiences this week as part of the writing program.

Last week grade one and two students practised skipping in the stadium. Various skills such as skipping forward and backwards, double skips and jumping the wiggly rope were trialled.

After writing a word splash, students wrote short recounts of the event from their perspectives.

There are entry forms available for students to fill in on the Home Reading Hero wall in Building A.

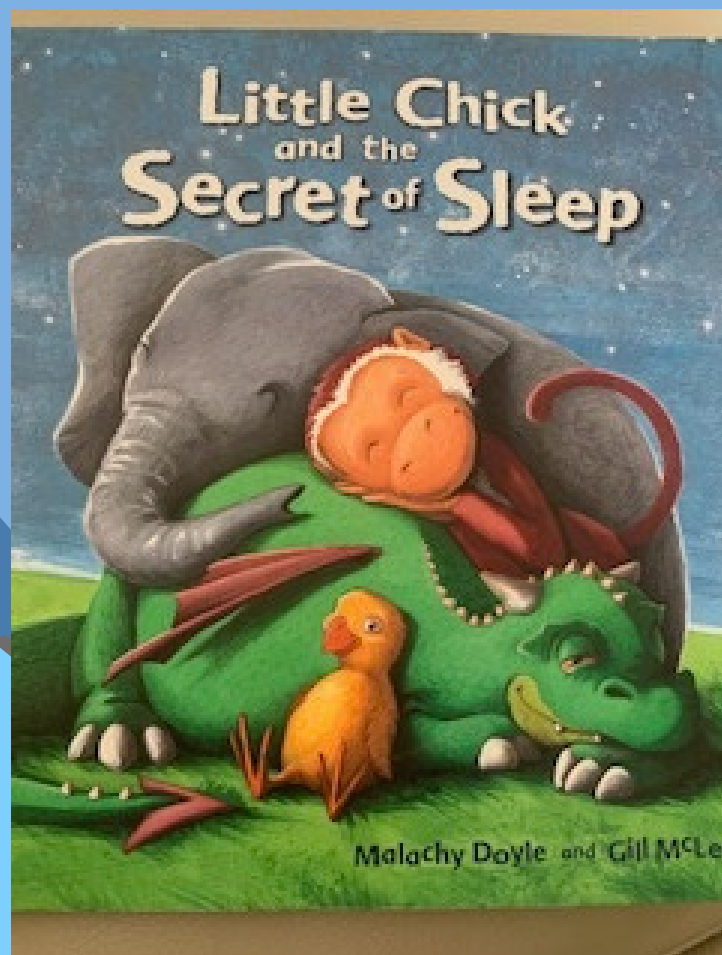

### WELLBEING

St Albans Heights Primary is a School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) school. SWPBS is a framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe, supportive learning cultures. We are being supported by the Department of Education throughout the implementation. When SWPBS is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. Students and staff benefit from:

- increased respectful and positive behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- increased adoption of evidence-based instructional practices
- a predictable learning environment with improved perceptions of safety and increased attendance.

This framework is based around our school values: Honesty, Excellence, Respect and Belonging. For this we have implemented our MVP cards, these are given to students when they are seen demonstrating the school values. Students can then use the MVP cards to exchange for things from our MVP shop.

We have also implemented a behaviour matrix. The matrix is based on our values and is a list of expected behaviours for areas across the school. A behaviour procedure has also been created to ensure students are familiar with minor and major behaviours and the process that teachers will use to improve behaviour. The matrix and behaviour procedure are explicitly taught at each year level. As part of our continued implementation, all behavioural incidents are recorded and a note sent home as a way of communicating low level behaviours. For major incidents a phone call and possibly a meeting with staff and student guardians will take place.
