


### Reading



In Writing, students have been particularly focusing on enhancing their own character descriptions by including traits, motives and describing physical appearance when introducing them in our narratives.










Throughout Inquiry, we have continued discovering more about the significant ways Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are connected to Country and Place.

"Huh ... I feel something, closely observing us ..." Diana said, looking around, strangely. It was if someone, or something was intently observing us.






