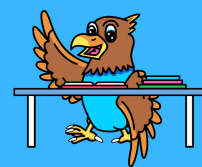

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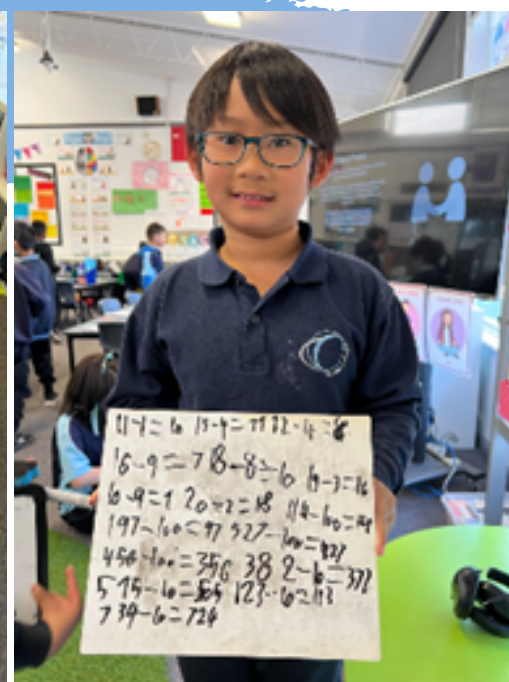
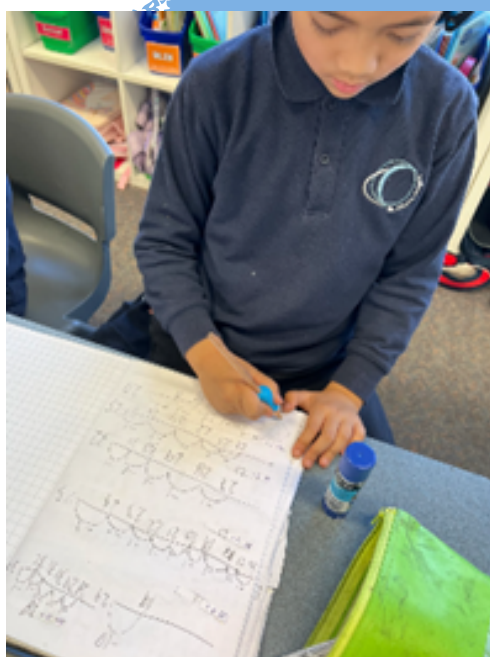

Welcome back for another term of amazing learning in the 1/2 cohort! The students have all settled back into school wonderfully and are ready for their new units of learning. We would like to congratulate all the students that have been reading everyday at home and filling in their diaries - you are improving in your reading and the home reading helps so much!

At the end of last term we completed our subtraction unit of numeracy, all the students took on challenges were working at a high standard for their year level. We were impressed by some being able to adapt the strategy of counting back in ones, to partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones and then jumping back with larger numbers. They have consolidated their use of number lines and have been able to impress staff with their independence at using the strategy. They also then used maths materials to check their calculations.

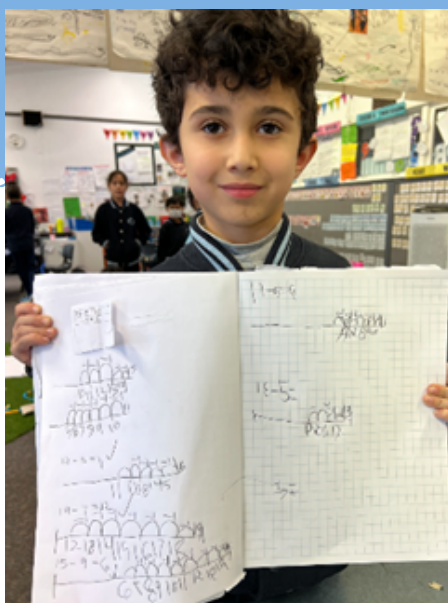
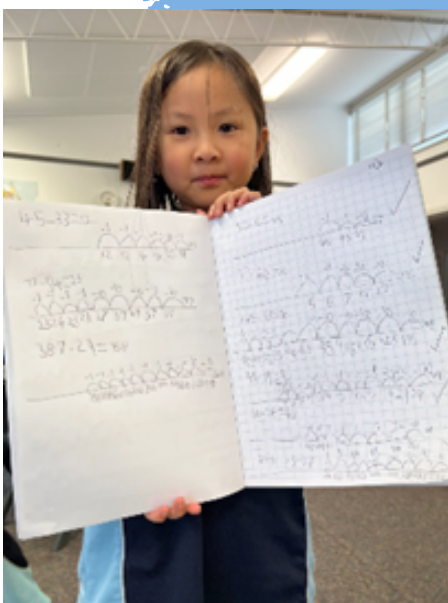
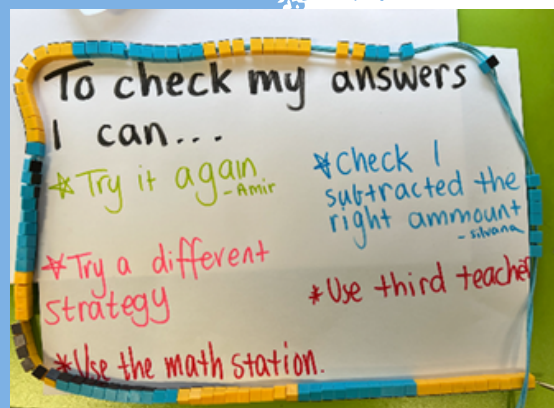
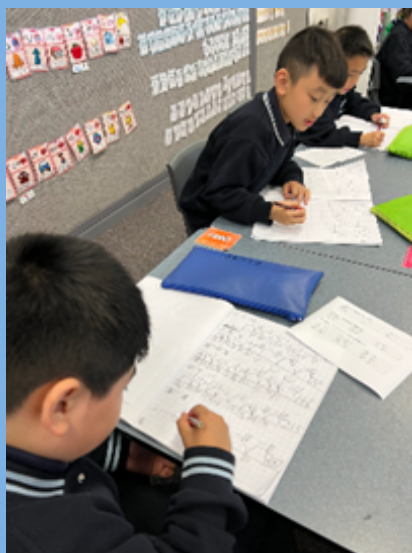
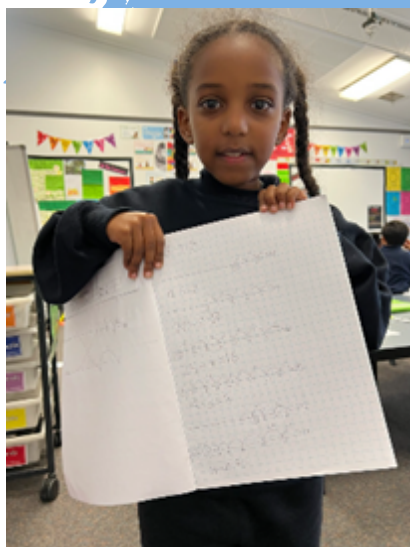
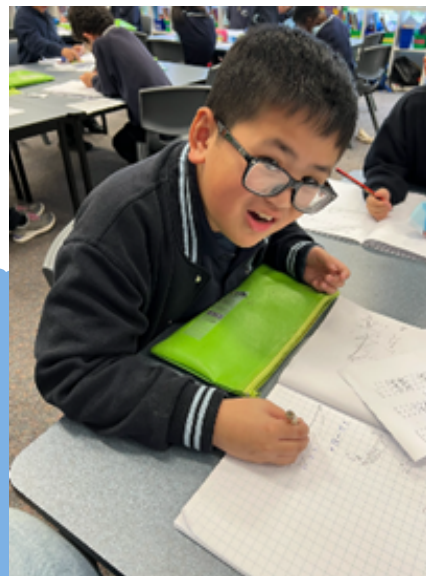
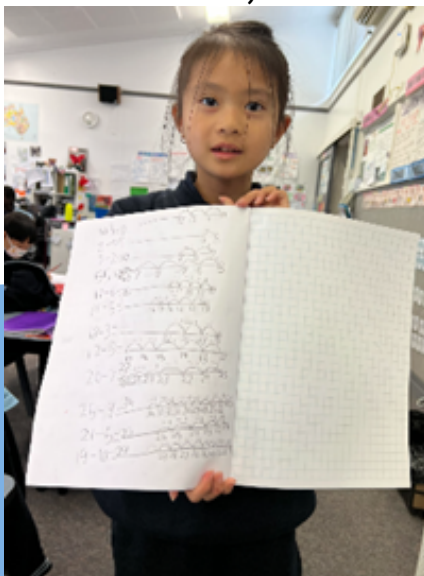
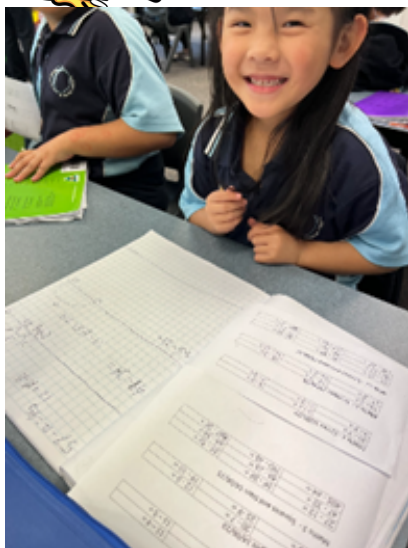
