In the lead up to Book Week, classes read some of the shortlisted books and created door displays to reflect a particular text.




This week students will participate in an incursion with the author Michael Wagner, learning about story writing, how to generate ideas and getting a chance to hear more of the books he has written.

Transport them to and from training and matches.


Be supportive and encouraging, even if they don't always win.


