Dear Parents and Carers.






Using 'Untitled Goose Game' in Writing

We decided to use a video game to enhance our ideas and build our story.



In today's fast-paced world, the importance of mental health is becoming increasingly evident. Just as we teach our students to read, write, and solve math problems, it is equally crucial to equip them with the knowledge and skills to understand and manage their mental health. This is where the concept of "mental health literacy" comes into play.

What is Mental Health Literacy?

Mental health literacy refers to our ability to recognise, understand, and effectively respond to mental health challenges and illnesses. It encompasses a range of knowledge and skills, including:

Recognizing Signs: Being able to identify the signs and symptoms of common mental health issues such as anxiety, depression, and stress.

Reducing Stigma: Understanding that mental health challenges are no different from physical health issues and should be treated without judgment or discrimination.

Seeking Help: Knowing when and how to seek help for oneself or a friend who may be struggling with

their mental health. **Self-Care:** I earning and practicing strategies to maintain good mental health, including stress.

Academic Performance: Good mental health is closely linked to academic success. When students are emotionally well, they are more likely to excel in their studies.

Life Skills: Mental health literacy is a valuable life skill that will serve students well beyond their school years.
