

We've had a wonderful and busy fortnight in the F/1 classrooms. In Maths students have been learning about units of measurement and understanding how to use a unit to measure the length of a different objects and each other! They have explored how to use units such as teddies or unifix blocks when measuring, including making sure they are the same size, facing the same direction and that there are no gaps. Students explored how to make a tool to help them measure items that are standing up or longer than 12 teddies.



On Friday October 26 students visited ACMI as part of our inquiry learning. Foundation students explored light and shadow through puppet making and grade one students participated in a coding workshop using iPads and the Osmo Program. We all got to visit the main ACMI gallery too and students were excited to see how games and televisions have changed over the years. Now we will use this learning to make our own puppets using light and shadow and to build our own games that use coding rules.


'...First 1/2B had to get split in half. It was half for 1/2C and half for 1/2A. First we watched some animation...'


Hi Everyone

HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED IN SCHOOL: BUILD THE HABIT OF GOOD ATTENDANCE EARLY SCHOOL SUCCESS GOES HAND IN HAND WITH GOOD ATTENDANCE!

Did you know?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, tertiary education and at work

What you can do

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots
- Introduce your child to teachers and classmates before school starts to help transition
- Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick
- Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counsellors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbour, or another parent
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session


ART PE STEM JAPANESE


STEM BY MRS KENNETT
