
COVID Update

Covid infections are on the rise again in the community. Please be vigilant and continue to test if showing cold and flu like symptoms. We have limited RAT tests available if families require them. Whilst attending school every day is crucial, it is also important to stay home if you are unwell. At school we continue with our COVID safe practices, include sanitising before entering classrooms, ensuring air purifiers are switched on, circulation of air in rooms, limiting the sharing of equipment etc.

We are also struggling to cover classes when teachers are away as there is a nation wide shortage of replacement teaching staff. I thank staff for their flexibility in swapping classes, doing extra yard duty or missing planning time. Please be aware that on some occasions and as a last resort, we will have to split a class for the day. In this instance students are given work to complete independently in another classroom.





In numeracy students have been learning about units of time such as the seasons, months and reading both digital and analogue clocks. They have also built their skills in using calendars.






Hi Everyone

We reflected on the importance of ANZAC day and how it relates to our daily lives.





Tuning into Kids Parenting Program. Facilitated through Melbourne City Mission

Welcome back to term 2. This term we have a new program being offered to our school and wider community.

This program will be running from our school this term called Tuning into Kids. The program is targeted at parents of children aged between 3-10 tears old. It is a free 6 week program run by professionally trained facilitators, the program teaches parents and carers skills in emotion coaching, a way of responding to emotions that can help children to understand, regulate and work through their emotions so that they manage their behaviour and respond in socially appropriate ways. In particular, the program teaches parents to notice children's emotions, especially before emotions have become overwhelming for the child.

Emotional intelligence helps prevent mental health problems, and learning these skills can reduce mental health difficulties if they are occurring.

Tuning in to Kids® also teaches parents and carers skills in being aware of how they express their own emotions when parenting. Parenting (and life) can be an emotionally challenging experience at times, and many parents benefit from reflecting on the ways they cope and manage their emotions. Children watch and copy how the people who raise them express emotions and so it is an important part of what benefits children. By learning to use emotion coaching skills, many parents and carers find their children talk to them more, want greater contact with them, and share more of their emotional experiences with them.
